

President's Message

Hi Residents,

Per the town meeting we had in the clubhouse on April 10, 2017, we the Board of Directors, received in no uncertain terms, that the rules and regulations were not being enforced. It was stated that the notices were being sent to violators but there wasn't enough follow-up.

In an attempt to rectify those complaints the Board and the Rules and Regulations committee has reviewed, changed. And added tot the Rules and Regulations to comply with the members wishes. The Board also has developed new procedures to address the major violations, such as number of dogs (or four legged animals) allowed, dog feces not being picked up both in yards of owners and owners walking dogs, also barking dogs will be addressed via Indian River County enforcement rules. The other major complaint was parking on the street after 10pm and the fact cars were not being towed away. This was also addressed in the revised rules and regulations along with the follow-up after a resident receives a notice (ticket) from patrol. The last complaint addressed in the meeting was the appearance of homes in the park, and the fact that residents were ignoring their letters received and continuing to violate the rules with no consequences. The much stricter follow-ups will be addressed and instituted in the revised Rules and Regulations. The revised Rules and Regulations will be available in the clubhouse on May 1st and for those that are unable to do so, we can deliver them upon request.

Treasurer's Message

Over the past month the Finance Committee/Staff have engaged in negotiations with a financial institution to refinance Lakewood Village.

A financial representative made a presentation to the full BOD and the RO in attendance on April 20, 2017.

As we move forward with this inquiry an audit of our land etc. will take place during the month of May.

Manager's Message

Cameras have now been installed in the compound. This will allow us to monitor this area 24 hours a day. Starting May 1, 2017 the compound will be unlocked from 8am to 6pm. Anyone that must have access to the compound after hours must use their key, BUT MUST LOCK THE GATE BEHIND YOU WHEN LEAVING. Anyone that is caught not obeying the rules will have their key taken from them and lose their compound privileges. As of May 1, 2017 there will be a new lock on the compound so those of you that need access after 6pm or on weekends must come to the office for a new key.

Anyone that has property in the compound must identify their property by coming to the office and reporting the description and/or a picture of the property and the compound sticker number to office personnel by May 31, 2017. Whatever has not been identified by that date will be towed away or hauled off.

Please let the office know if you have a problem with the new lawn service. PLEASE come into the office and make out a complaint form so that we can present them to the lawn service.

If anyone desires to sell their home these are the steps that MUST be followed:

- 1. An Intent to Sell must be filled out.
- 2. The ARC committee will do a review of the property and notify the homeowner of anything that needs to be done before selling the property
- 3. Any perspective buyer must come to the office and fill out the application for residency. There is a \$50.00 fee per adult. Part of the application is the credit history and criminal background check, which is done by the office, prior to purchasing the home. The perspective new residents must be approved by the interview committee and the BOD.
- 4. The title to the mobile home should be transferred immediately to the new owner once approved.
- 5. If a share is involved in the purchase the Atlantic Coastal does the closing.




The staff is determining ways to distribute the Voice of the Village after September 2017. We NEED your input of how you you would like to have your copy of the newsletter distributed to you.

Please be advised that we <u>ARE</u> taking a stronger stance on the inspections; from this point forward if you do not comply with the letter received or contact the office your file <u>WILL BE</u> sent to the attorney for eviction or foreclosure for non-compliance. If the home needs to be weeded or pressure washed and this is not completed then it will be done by the Association and the fees will be passed on to the resident. If the fees aren't paid, the amount will be sent to attorney for non-payment.

We all wish to live in a beautiful maintained Community that you can be proud to call home. The Board of Directors is also looking at eventually bringing new homes into the Community to try and fill the many vacant lots we have, but when houses are left a mess and not maintained; it makes that task much harder to achieve. People want to live in a Community where residents take pride in the way their home looks. The better your home looks the easier it is for our future residents to say "Yes! This is a beautiful Community I would love to live in".
