MANAGER'S MESSAGE

We have all survived the hurricane and are now moving forward with clean-up. A HUGE THANK YOU to each of you that took your time and energy to help your neighbors. That is the definition of true community!! Please be patient with us as the clean-up process is taking more time than anticipated, due to Waste Management sub-contracting the pick- up of the debris.

The RV sites are being rented. We have our first rental that has been scheduled for January 2018. We are looking forward to many other spots being rented between now and December.

A new lock has been purchased and as of October 1, 2017 anyone that has property in the compound must come in to get a new key and re-register your property.

PROCESS FOR SELLING YOUR HOME

- 1. An Intent to Sell must be filled out.
- 2. The ARC committee will do a review of the property and notify the homeowner of anything that needs to be done before selling the property.
- 3. Any perspective buyer must come to the office and fill out the application for residency. There is a \$50.00 fee per adult. Part of the application is the credit history and criminal background check, which is done by the office, prior to purchasing the home. The prospective new residents must be approved by the interview committee and the BOD.
- 4. The title to the mobile home should be transferred immediately to the new owner once approved and the closing is complete.
- 5. If a share is involved in the purchase the Atlantic Coastal does the closing.

FOUR LEGGED PETS

ALL FOUR -LEGGED PETS OVER THE AGE OF 4 MONTHS MUST BE LICENSED. IT IS UNLAWFUL TO ALLOW PETS TO RUN AT LARGE (OFF THE PROPERTY OF THE OWNER) THIS INCLUDES ALL DOGS AND CATS, KEEPING A HABITUALLY LOUD BARKING, YELPING OR HOWLING DOMESTIC PET IS UNLAWFUL. THE FLORIDA STATUTE ALOWS THE PARK TO FINE UP TO \$100.00 PER VIOLATION

- > Please do not feed the Feral cats or other wildlife around the neighborhood.
- We would like to remind everyone to look at their home and home site to ensure that it looks the best it could possibly look. We would like everyone to be proud of where they live and have their family and friends envy our Community.
- We love our 4-legged residents, but ask that when you are walking them around the community or in the dog park to please pick up after them so that other residents and their pets may enjoy the same right. Also, please do your best to avoid your dog from using a resident's yard. Although you may pick up after the dog there is usually something left behind.

- DO NOT park on the grass. Violation tickets are being issued. Cars and trucks with be towed away after the second violation.

- Remember to have your car decal on your vehicle to avoid being towed away.

These rules will be implemented for any future emergencies/hurricanes etc.

Rules & Regulations

- You must bring your own Food & Drinks
- You must bring your own cooler & ice to store your own items
- You must bring your own paper goods/toiletries
- You must bring you own air mattress, pillows, sheets etc.
- Quiet time will be enforced from 11pm-6am
- ALL pets MUST be in a crate and placed on the stage.
- All children/teenagers must be kept by your side AT ALL TIMES
- There will be designated smoking times enforced. (times will be given to you the day you come)
- EVERYONE must sign up for a cleanup duty or chore. Ex: bathroom, mopping, sweeping, trash etc.
- The kitchen will NOT be available to anyone.
- ONLY medicine or emergency items will be stored for you in the fridge & must be given to a staff member to put away for you or give it to you when you need it.
- The outside bathrooms will not be available during quiet time or when the hurricane winds start picking up.
- Food or drinks will no longer be provided during the stay.

When you come in you will be instructed to sign then and receive a copy of these rules. You MUST abide by them. Those who fail to do so will be banned and will no longer be allowed to come here for shelter during a hurricane/emergency etc.

We at Lakewood Village pride ourselves in being a community that helps each other, but when some people do not cooperate, unfortunately, we have to enforce boundaries and rules.

We are glad that we made it safe through Irma. Thanks again for being a resident at Lakewood Village.

Please be advised that we <u>ARE</u> taking a stronger stance on the inspections; from this point forward if you do not comply with the letter received or contact the office your file <u>WILL BE</u> sent to the attorney for eviction or foreclosure for non-compliance. If the home needs to be weeded or pressure washed and this is not completed then it will be done by the Association and the fees will be passed on to the resident. If the fees aren't paid, the amount will be sent to attorney for non-payment.

We all wish to live in a beautiful maintained Community that you can be proud to call home. The Board of Directors is also looking at eventually bringing new homes into the Community to try and fill the many vacant lots we have, but when houses are left a mess and not maintained; it makes that task much harder to achieve. This is a beautiful Community I would love to live in".
