Home Inspections

Please take a good look at and around your home. Inspection letters have been sent to many residents. Most do comply with what action is needed to maintain their home. Unfortunately, we also have some residents who choose not to comply with the rules and regulations when it comes to maintaining their home. Please be advised that we <u>ARE</u> taking a stronger stance on the inspections; from this point forward if you do not comply with the letter received or contact the office your file <u>WILL BE</u> sent to the attorney for eviction or foreclosure for non-compliance. If the home needs to be weeded or pressure washed and this is not completed then it will be done by the Association and the fees will be passed on to the resident. If the fees aren't paid, the amount will be sent to attorney for non-payment.

We all wish to live in a beautiful maintained Community that you can be proud to call home. The Board of Directors is also looking at eventually bringing new homes into the Community to try and fill the many vacant lots we have, but when houses are left a mess and not maintained; it makes that task much harder to achieve. People want to live in a Community where residents take pride in the way their home looks. The better your home looks the easier it is for our future residents to say "Yes! This is a beautiful Community I would love to live in". If Lakewood Village is able to bring in new homes and fill some of the vacant lots this will allows us to generate more income which in turn for the residents means you are less likely to be given a rent increase. PROCESS FOR SELLING YOUR HOME

- 1. An intent to Sell must be filled out.
- 2. The ARC committee will do a review of the property and notify the homeowner of anything that needs to be done before selling the property.
- 3. Any perspective buyer must come to the office and fill out the application for residency. There is a \$50.00 fee per adult. Part of the application is the credit history and criminal background check, which is done by the office, prior to purchasing the home. The prospective new residents must be approved by the interview committee and the BOD.
- 4. The title to the mobile home should be transferred immediately to the new owner once approved and the closing is complete.
- 5. If a share is involved in the purchase the Atlantic Coastal does the closing.

FOUR LEGGED PETS

ALL FOUR -LEGGED PETS OVER THE AGE OF 4 MONTHS MUST BE LICENSED. IT IS UNLAWFUL TO ALLOW PETS TO RUN AT LARGE (OFF THE PROPERTY OF THE OWNER) THIS INCLUDES ALL DOGS AND CATS, KEEPING A HABITUALLY LOUD BARKING, YELPING OR HOWLING DOMESTIC PET IS UNLAWFUL. THE FLORIDA STATUTE ALOWS THE PARK TO FINE UP TO \$100.00 PER VIOLATION




WHAT NOT TO FLUSH

- Paper towels, disposable wipes, washcloths and rags
- Synthetic materials such as plastic, which do not decompose or dissolve
 - Feminine products
- Cotton balls
- Diapers and baby wipes
- Unused Medications
- Syringes
- Fats, Oil and Grease

You and Indian River County share the responsibilities and ownership of the systems for disposal of your wastewater.

The County owns and maintains the wastewater treatment plant, pump stations, and miles of sewer lines.

You own and maintain your household plumbing and part of the line that carries the waste to the line in the street.



When you keep grease out of your lines, you protect your system and the public system by preventing sewage back-ups in your and your neighbor's homes and spills from the County's systems.

Keep Your Drains Fat Free

- Let cooking grease and oils cool and dispose of them in the garbage.
- Never use hot water to rinse grease off surfaces
- Wipe out greasy pots and pans with a spatula or paper towel before you wash them.
- Throw the fat trimmed from meat and poultry into the garbage, not into the garbage disposal.
- dressing, gravy, butter, margarine, and other oil-based foods in the garbage NOT down the drain
- Teach your family proper grease disposal.



Oil and grease can build up in the County's Sewer System blocking the flow of wastewater causing back-ups and overflows.

The County's lines aren't the only system clogged by grease. Your own household plumbing can also become clogged.

When you keep your drains fat free, you help Indian River County keep your sewer fees down, and you could save some money in the process.
